

MEDICINAL PLANT WEALTH OF ANDHRA PRADESH – PART I

ABSTRACT: This paper presents the Medical Plant Wealth of Andhra Pradesh based on the results of Medico – Ethno – Botanical exploration undertaken during the last fourteen years (1971 – 72 till the end of 1984). In all, 117 well known medicinal plants widely used in Ayurveda, Siddha and other systems of Medicine are enumerated here.

The State of Andhra Pradesh extending over an area of 2, 75,000 Sq. Km is situated between 76°45' & 84°45' longitude (East) and 12°38' & 19°54' latitude (North). The State abounds with rich flora and vegetation chiefly due to the presence of vast stretch of the Eastern Ghats facing the Bay of Bengal. As it stands now, about a quarter of the total area of the State is occupied by the forests. There are two perennial rivers, viz., the Krishna and the Godavari with several notable tributaries and rivulets flowing across the State, thus making the land very fertile and cultivable.

The forest vegetation of Andhra Pradesh may be classified broadly into 1) The Moist Deciduous, 2) The Dry – Deciduous and 3) The Scrub. Of these, the moist deciduous forests with a few evergreen species cover a very limited area and are seen only small pockets amongst the drydeciduous forests at higher elevations. The scrub jungles are either of climatic climax or formed by the constant interference and ruthless destruction of the deciduous forests by the inhabitants. A fourth type of vegetation namely the Mangrove vegetation is also seen about the brackish waters along the coast in

certain localities. In addition to these, aquatic flora in fresh water lakes, ponds, along the shallow river and stream waters is of common occurrence.

The State of Andhra Pradesh is divided into 23 districts. During the last fourteen years i.e., since 1971 – 72 till the end of 1984 Medico – Ethno – Botanical Survey was undertaken in sixteen districts namely Hyderabad, Medak, Adilabad, Karimnagar, Warangal, Khammam, Kurnool, Chitoor, Nellore, Prakasam, Guntur, Krishna, West Godavari, East Godavari, Visakhapatnam and Srikakulam districts. Casual observations were however made in the remaining districts of Rangareddi, Nizambad, Nalgonda, Mahabubnagar, Anantapur, Cuddapah and Vizianagaram.

In the following pages an enumcration of abundantly available Medicinal Plants is presented alphabetically, by their Latin names followed by family and also their Sanskrit, Vernacular and Tamil names if available. For every plant information such as parts used, season of collection and district wise distribution is given.
